

### G.T. County Cancer Drive Kick-off Lunch Thursday

The 1971 kick-off luncheon Thursday for the campaign of the Grand Traverse County Unit of the American Cancer Society will feature guest speaker, Albert Hubbard of Grand Rapids who will discuss his experiences as a laryngectomy patient of long standing and his volunteer work in teaching esophageal and pharyngeal speech.

Hubbard will speak to approximately 500 cancer drive volunteers who will attend the luncheon at 12:15 p.m. Thursday at Shield's Restaurant. The cancer drive will be conducted April 26-28.

Hubbard, who has taught over 500 people in Michigan during the last 15 years to speak following surgery for the removal of the larynx, is a past president of the International Association of Laryngectomies and is currently president of the West Michigan New Voice Club.

He serves on the board of trustees of the Kent County Unit of the American Cancer Society and is business manager of the United Furniture Workers of America - AFL - CIO in Grand Rapids. Hubbard was given the Man of the Year Award by the Kent County Council of AFL in 1967 for outstanding community service.

### Ask Lon Nol To Remain

PHNOM PENH (UPI)—Cambodian Chief of State Cheng Heng accepted the resignation of Prime Minister Lon Nol today but immediately asked him to form a new government, Radio Cambodia announced.

The brief broadcast also said the National Assembly met this morning and unanimously approved the promotion of Lon Nol to the rank of Marshal of the Cambodian Armies and gave him the title of National Hero.

The developments in the Cambodian political situation appeared to confirm statements made Tuesday by Lon Nol's brother, Col. Lon Non, who said the resignation was little more than a formality.

In July of 1959 she was united in marriage to Jude Wright, who preceded her in death in January of 1961.

Surviving are a daughter, Mrs. Enid Sanborn of Traverse City; two granddaughters, Mrs. Dakota and Mrs. Robert (Yvonne) Burbank of New York state, eight great grandchildren and other relatives.

Funeral services will be held at 2:30 p.m. Friday at Martinson funeral home in Traverse City. Burial will be made in Yuba cemetery.

### Ed Board Opposes Milliken Plan

LANSING (UPI)—The State Board of Education says it is opposed to Gov. William G. Milliken's plan to appoint a commission on higher education to study the needs of colleges and universities.

The resolution said the proposed commission would be assigned duties which are "identical to certain crucial duties which the constitution and the people of Michigan have vested in the state Board of Education."

In a formal resolution, Tuesday the board asked Attorney General Frank J. Kelley for a ruling stating whether the governor would be "unlawfully usurping the constitutional authority of the publicly elected State Board of Education," by appointing the commission.




