matching hat and carried a colonial bouquet of carnations.

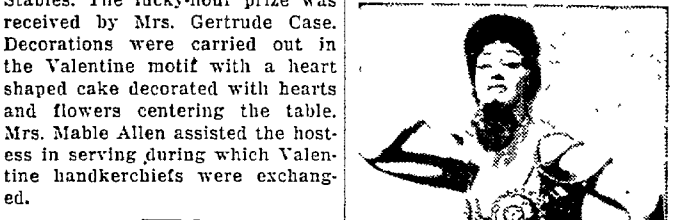
The groom was attended by Wallace Schaub, brother of the bride, and Delbert Jarvie, brother of the groom.
