SCHOOL BUS DRIVER DIES WHILE ALONE

REEDSPORT, Ore. (AP)—A school bus, which, only a short time before had been loaded with some 50 grade school pupils, plunged over a high bank into a field near here yesterday.

The bus driver, Harold Andrews, 55—the only occupant—was dead inside. He apparently suffered a fatal heart seizure, said Deputy Coroner Jack Ungar.

First reports, relayed here by radio, that the bus had plunged into nearby Smith River sent a wave of panic through this southern Oregon coastal town. It was thought that the children might still have been aboard.

The children had been let off earlier, however, and Andrews was en route to pick up another load when he was stricken.

2 Charged As Drunk Drivers

Police have charged two motorists with driving, while intoxicated after being involved in traffic accidents.

Arraigned yesterday in Traffic Court, Francis J. Small, 35, Split Rock, pleaded innocent to driving while intoxicated before Judge Truman H. Preston.

Judge Preston ordered Small's license and registration suspended pending disposition of the case on March 28. Bail was set at \$1,500.

Small was arrested about 11:30 p.m. Wednesday when Patrolman Donald Donohue reported his car pulled from a driveway in the 800 block of W. Fayette street into the path of a car driven by Thomas O'Boyle, 35, of 708 James St. Donohue said the O'Boyle car applied the brakes and swerved to the left but struck the rear of the Small car.

O'Boyle was taken to Onondaga General Hospital and police say he suffered a concussion.

Also arrested for driving while intoxicated was Keith Nelipowitz, 28, of 7 North st., Liverpool, when his car struck one driven by William Jenkins, 48, East Syracuse.

Patrolman Carl Kurtz said Nelipowitz was driving west in the 1500 block of Burnett avenue when his car struck the Jenkins vehicle going in the opposite direction.

Nelipowitz was to be arraigned today in Traffic Court.

Hope Flies To Moscow

NEW YORK (UP)—Bob Hope wisecracked his way toward Moscow today to make two filmed television shows featuring Russian entertainers.

The comedian left New York by air Thursday. He will switch to a Soviet airliner at Copenhagen and is due in the Russian capital today.

Hope said he expected no language difficulties "unless they ask me something." He plans a six-day visit but quipped that he wasn't sure how long the Russians would let him stay. Pointing to the visa on his passport, he said, "I don't know Russian, but I think at the bottom of this thing it says 'Yank, go home.'"

Hope said he jokingly considers himself a "cultural exchange." Some of the "culture" he will display there includes a movie, "Paris Holiday," in which Anita Ekberg is his co-star.

He plans to come home with enough film for two television shows that will be aired in April.
