Troops Guard Canal Zone

BALBOA, CANAL ZONE, Nov. 4 —(UPI)—U.S. army troops equipped with machineguns and mortars guarded the borders of the canal zone today against any new invasion attempt by mobs of anti-American nationalists from the Panama republic. Rioting nationalists in Panama City yesterday ripped to shreds the U.S. embassy flag, smashed windows in U.S. agencies, burned automobiles and stoned U.S. canal zone guards. The U.S. consulate in Colon at the Atlantic end of the 50-mile wide isthmus also was attacked. Troops kept the rioters out of the canal zone itself.
