R. W. Sanborn Dies of Injuries

Robert William Sanborn, 29, former Traverse City and area resident, died early Sunday morning in Hennessey, Okla., following an accident while working in oil fields near there.

Mr. Sanborn was born on November 14, 1939 at Yuba and lived in Traverse City and on Old Mission Peninsula. He attended Old Mission school and Traverse City high school.

He joined the U. S. marine corps in March, 1957 and found employment as a truck driver in the Hennessey oil fields after discharge from service last March.

Mr. Sanborn is survived by his mother, Mrs. Enid Sanborn of Traverse City; two sisters, Mrs. Silvia Spor of Traverse City and Yvonne Burbank of Syracuse, N. Y.; his paternal grandfather, Wallace Sanborn of Yuba; a grandmother, Mrs. Ruth Bahr of Muskegon; and one cousin.

He was preceded in death by his father, Robert E. Sanborn, and other grandparents.

The body will arrive at noon on Wednesday and be taken to Martinson funeral home, where funeral services will be held at 2:00 p.m. on Thursday. Dr. Howard R. Towne will officiate, with burial in the family lot at Grand Traverse Memorial Gardens.

Parsons To Pay in \$2 Bills

To dramatize the value of an industrial payroll to the community, Parsons Corporation of Traverse City will pay its employees in two-dollar bills on Thursday.

In making the announcement, President John Parsons said that the payroll will total about \$35,000 for some 300 employees, with the two-dollar bills being easily traced as they circulate through the community and area.

The company said it hopes merchants and banks will assist in the project by recirculating the currency for several days to emphasize the payroll value.

The Chamber of Commerce, now launching a large-scale regional promotion drive, has expressed enthusiastic support for the Parsons plan. The C-C campaign will include promotion of industry as well as other phases of the Grand Traverse Bay Region economy.

A LOVELY'S HANDS. To be thought charming, the feminine hand need only be well-tended and gracefully managed. Size and shape are of little import, unless you model for hand-cream ads.

Proper hand care is mainly a matter of habit. If you get into the hand-lotion habit, the weekly manicure habit, the chip-repair habit and the work-glove habit the physical appearance of your hands will never be found wanting.
