Len Ligon, a former Traverse City athlete, now living in Grand Rapids, placed seventh in the junior national slalom Saturday at Jackson Hole, Wyoming to complete the finest record of any Central states skier competing in this year's nationals. Ligon skied under the banner of the Grand Traverse Ski Club.
Other high finishers in the slalom were the following: Dave Merrill, tied for 19th; Jerry Stanek, tied for 39th; Jim Hoehsler of Cadillac, 44th; and Jerry Kaumerer, in 57th place.
The only girl to grab a high finish was Linnell Hayes of Gaylord who was 19th in the event Saturday.
The team left Rock Springs, Wyoming Sunday morning and will arrive in Chicago Monday noon. The skiers will then return home in private cars.

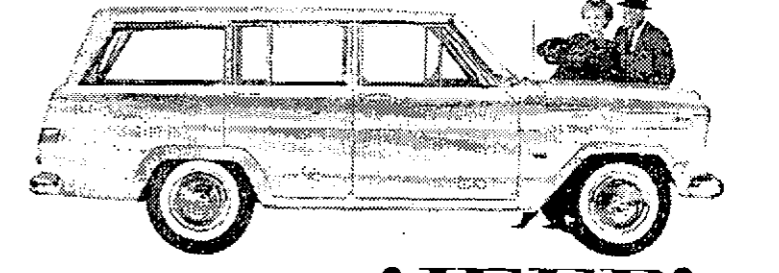
