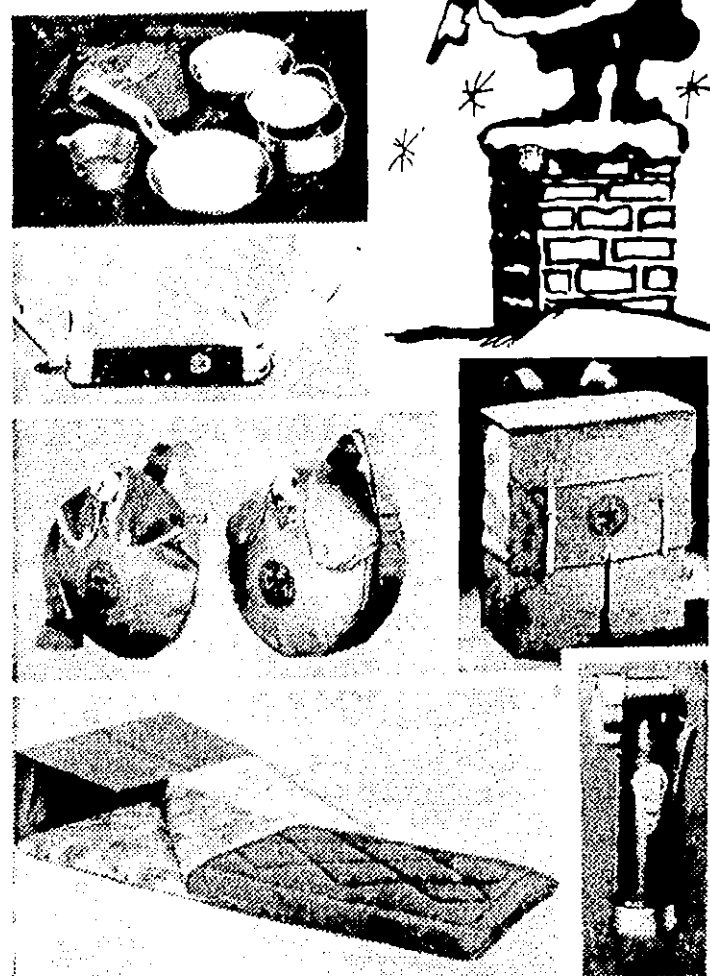
Kathleen Norris Granddaughter Dies

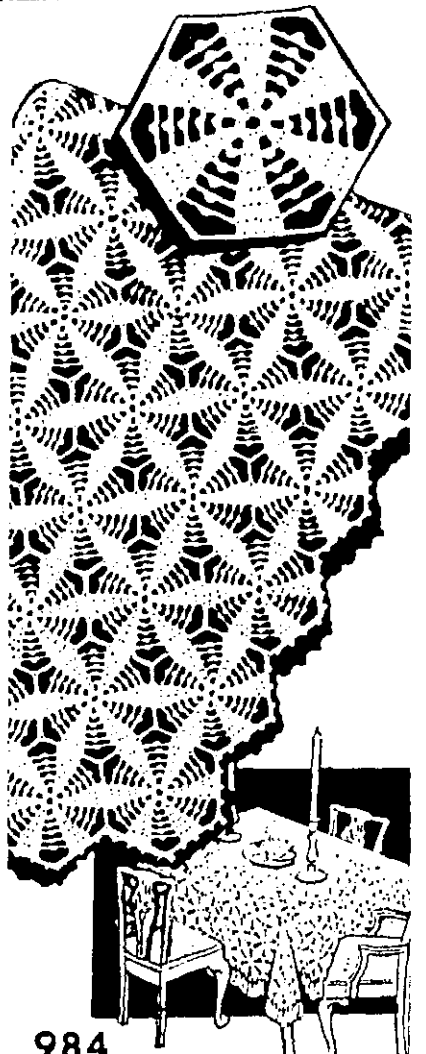
University Bars Military Recruiters

WASHINGTON (UPI) — George Washington University has barred military recruiters from its campus until draft director Lewis B. Hershey's directive calling for induction of antidraft demonstrators is reviewed.

Lloyd H. Elliott, university president, announced Friday he had "suspended all recruiting by all military services on the campus until General Hershey's letter of Nov. 8, 1967, has been rescinded, overruled, or clarified."

He said the action was recommended by the university senate, a faculty group; the faculty-student committee on student life; and the student council.

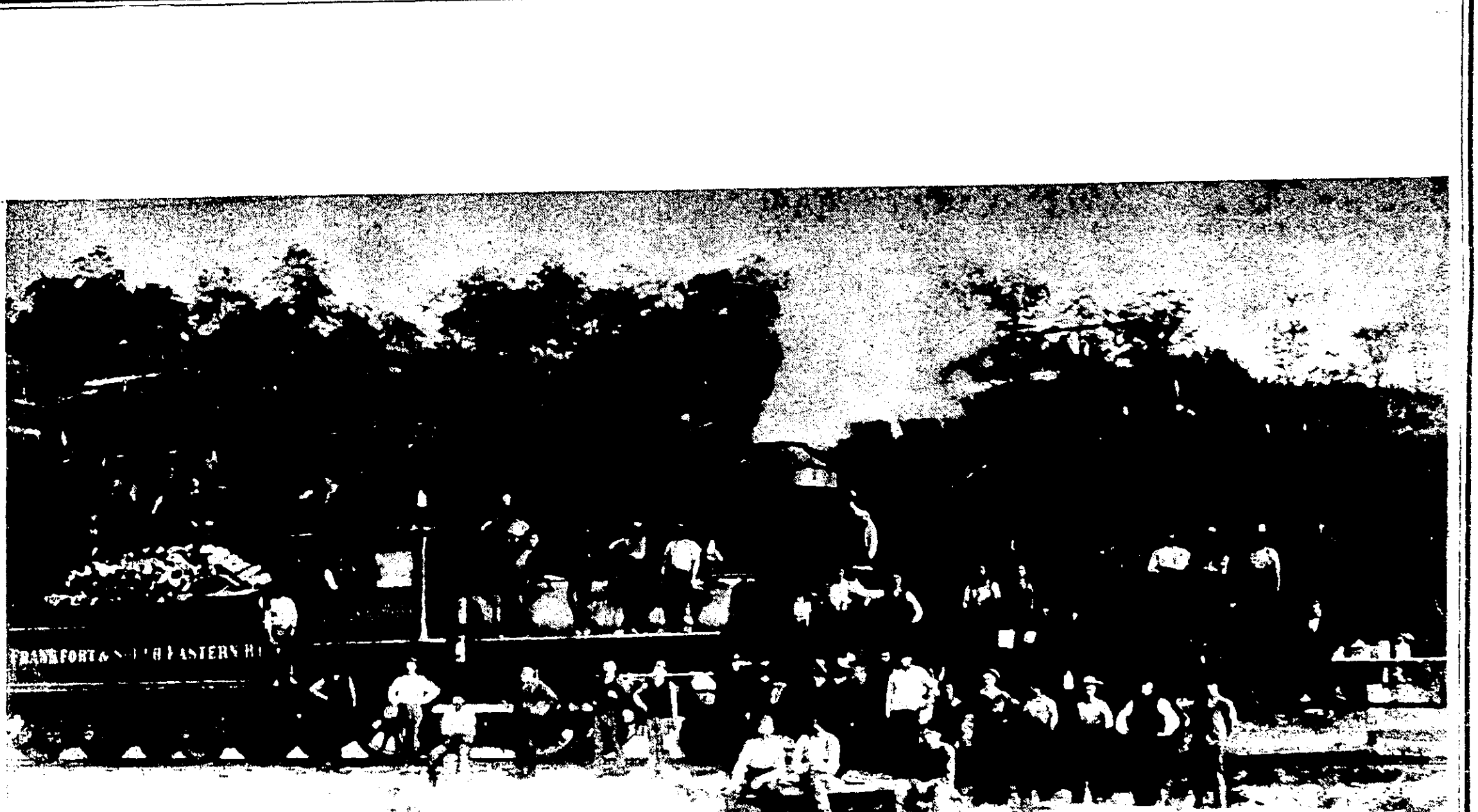

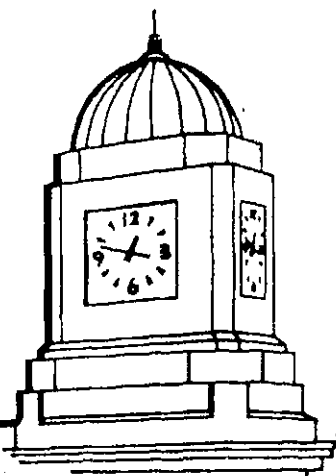

The Great Wood-Burning Locomotives Like the Above, Which Operated Between Copemish and Frankfort Three-Quarters of a Century Ago?

The "Frankfort & South Eastern" Railway, operating between Copemish and Frankfort, was purchased by the Ann Arbor Railroad Company in 1892, according to information accompanying the above picture. At that time, substantial changes of line and grade were made before it was operated with heavy equipment. That same year, work on the slip and ferry terminals at Frankfort and at Keweenaw, Wisconsin was staked out and construction was begun. The above group is probably the construction crew that worked on the development of the line and ferry terminal at that time. Must have taken a lot of wood to keep that boiler fired up!
