Pulitzer Prize-Winning Author John Patrick Dies

DELRAY BEACH, Fla. (AP) — John Patrick, the Pulitzer-prize winning author of "Teahouse of the August Moon" and screenplays for such films as "Love is a Many Splendored Thing," has committed suicide at age 90, police said.

Patrick was found dead Tuesday with a plastic bag over his head at an assisted care living facility where he'd lived for several years, said Palm Beach County sheriff's Sgt. William Springer.

"They come around and check, and I think this was a housekeeper that discovered him in the morning," Springer said. The medical examiner's office ruled the death a suicide, he said.

Springer said Patrick was not terminally ill and had no illnesses "any more than normal for a 90-something year-old gentleman."

He left behind a poem titled "A Suicide Note." It read in part, "I won't dispute my right to die/ I'll only give the reasons why/ You reach a certain point in time/ When life has lost reason and rhyme."

Patrick, who made his home in Suffern, was awarded the Pulitzer Prize, the New York Drama Critics Award and several other prizes in 1954 for his play "Teahouse of the August Moon."

He won the Screen Writers Guild award in 1957 for the musical "Les Girls."

His other movie scripts included "Three Coins in the Fountain," (1954); "Love is a Many Splendored Thing" (1955); "High Society" (1956); "Teahouse of the August Moon" (1956); "The World of Suzie Wong" (1960); "Main Attraction" (1962) and "Shoes of the Fisherman" (1968).
